Casey announces more shows after sell-out tour

AFTER wowing fans with a series of intimate shows in the capital this week, **PADDY CASEY** has announced two new concert dates next month.

Ireland's favourite singer-songwriter played storming sets to capacity crowds at Crawdaddy on Monday night and Eamon Doran's last night.

He concludes the dates at The Village tomorrow, where no doubt he'll raise the roof again with rousing tracks from his new album, *Addicted To Company* (Part 1).

However, if you missed out on Paddy this week, fear not he will play The Olympia Theatre on October 29 and Vicar Street on October 30.

Tickets for both concerts are priced €33.60 and they go on sale this Friday September 14 at 9am from Ticketmaster and usual outlets nationwide.

Addicted To Company (Part 1), Paddy's third studio album was released last week to critical acclaim and commercial success.

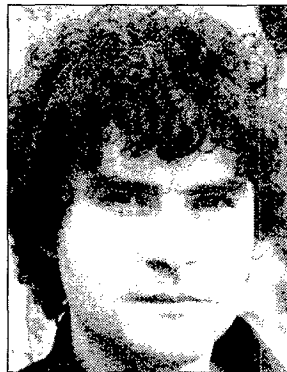
As the follow-up to his massively successful first two albums, *Living and Amen* (So Be It), the new long player was hugely anticipated by Paddy's legions of Irish fans.

The first single taken from the album is Addicted To Company and is out now.

Paddy Casey has sold in excess of 220,000 albums (14 times platinum) — making him one of the most successful musicians performing in Ireland today.

The past four years have

seen Paddy headlining shows at the RDS and Dublin Castle, performing in front of thousands at Millennium Stadium in Cardiff and supporting U2 in Europe and in Croke Park.
